Introduction and Methodology





- The Maine Office of Tourism has commissioned DPA to conduct a visitor research program designed to provide information on tourism activity in Maine and explore the motivations of visitors. **The Maine Office of Tourism Visitor Research Program** is conducted online, with survey participants recruited from the *ResearchNow* national online panel.
- Information is gathered using three main surveys on an ongoing basis:
 - Regional Travel Survey
 - Includes travelers living in New England, NJ, NY, PA, DE, MD, DC, and Eastern Canada;
 - Respondents are screened to see if they have taken an overnight trip to Maine in the past four weeks. If they have, they are asked to complete the Maine Overnight Visitors Survey.
 - Maine Day Visitor Survey
 - Includes travelers living within Maine or within a 100-mile radius of Maine's borders who have taken a day trip in Maine that is at least 50 miles from home within the past four weeks.
 - National Omnibus Survey
 - Includes a nationally balanced sample of US residents; and
 - Used to determine the incidence of travel nationwide and Maine's share of that travel.



- This report outlines results from calendar year 2012, with travel occurring between January 2012 and December 2012.
- Data was collected between January 1st and December 15th 2012. The number of completed statewide surveys collected for each research component are as follows:
 - Maine Overnight Visitor Survey 2,497
 - Maine Day Visitor 1,520
 - National Omnibus Survey 17,722



- The following report includes data on leisure visitors to the **Aroostook County** tourism region. *Due to the small available sample size of leisure visitors to this region, results for 2011 and 2012 have been combined for Aroostook County and include:*
 - 63 overnight leisure visitors, and
 - 74 day leisure visitors.

Overnight Leisure Visitor Demographics

• Overnight leisure visitors to Aroostook County are on average relatively young, with an average age of 42 years.

Overnight Leisure Visitor Residence

Not surprising due to its proximity to Aroostook County, New Brunswick supplied the largest proportion of overnight leisure visitors to Aroostook County in 2011 and 2012. This was a much higher proportion than for overnight leisure visitors to Maine as a whole. Conversely, Aroostook County attracted a lower proportion of visitors from New York and Massachusetts than did the rest of the State.

First-Time vs. Repeat Visitors

• About one-fifth of overnight leisure visitors to Aroostook County in 2011 and 2012 were first-time visitors, a similar proportion as for the State of Maine as a whole.

Primary Purpose of Overnight Leisure Trips

• Overnight leisure visitors to Aroostook County were mostly visiting the area to *tour/see the sites* or for *outdoor recreation*. Aroostook County was less likely to be a destination *to get away to relax, to enjoy nature,* and *because it's what we do every year* than other regions in the State.

Overnight Leisure Trip Activities

- Outdoor activities enjoyed by overnight leisure visitors to Aroostook County included various water activities, hiking/climbing, canoeing, and kayaking. A higher proportion of visitors spent time canoeing while visiting Aroostook County than other regions in the State.
- Some proportion of respondents selected going to the beach as an activity. Since there are no real opportunities to visit an ocean beach in Aroostook County, they may be thinking of a lake beach or may be confused as to which areas fall into Aroostook County.

• Day leisure visitors to Aroostook County are slightly older and more likely to be married compared to overnight visitors to this region.

Day Leisure Visitor Residence

- Consistent with overnight leisure visitors and its proximity to Aroostook County, New Brunswick supplied three-fourths of day leisure visitors to this region. In-state travelers represented 15% of day leisure visitors to Aroostook County.
- For those visitors from Massachusetts stating that they visited Aroostook County as a day trip, we hypothesize they may have been coming from elsewhere in Maine or Canada for their day trip.

First-Time vs. Repeat Visitors

• Nearly all leisure day visitors to Aroostook County in 2011 and 2012 were repeat visitors, similar to leisure day visitors for the rest of the State.





Party Size and Composition

• Similar to day leisure visitors to the rest of the State, one-fourth of those visiting Aroostook County were traveling with children.

• Following on the high proportion of day leisure visitors from New Brunswick, *shopping* was by far the most frequently cited reason for traveling to Aroostook County in 2011 and 2012.

Day Leisure Trip Activities

• Shopping was the most common trip activity on day leisure trips to Aroostook County, with three-fourths of travelers indicating that they shopped while visiting. The activities that Aroostook County visitors participated in differed from the rest of the State, as illustrated by the circled numbers in the chart below.

Day Leisure Outdoor Trip Activities

- Outdoor activities in general were less popular among day leisure visitors to Aroostook County than for the rest of the State. Among those who did participate in outdoor activities, the most popular activities were various water activities, golfing, and hiking/climbing.
- As with overnight leisure visitors, some proportion of respondents selected <u>going to the beach</u> as an activity. Since there are no real opportunities to visit an ocean beach in Aroostook County, they may be thinking of a lake beach or may be confused as to which areas fall into Aroostook County.

• Houlton was the most frequently visited town in Aroostook County among day leisure visitors, followed by Presque Isle.

Future Travel Likelihood

• Half of day leisure visitors to Aroostook County report that they *already have specific plans to travel in Maine* in the next two years, and an additional 41% say that they *definitely will travel in Maine*. This compares to the proportion who responded similarly among visitors to the State of Maine as a whole.

Comparisons

- Visitors to the Aroostook County region and visitors to the State of Maine as a whole differ in a few areas. These variations can be seen primarily in the visitor origin, as well as their reasons for traveling and the activities they participate in while visiting.
- Highlights:
 - Visitor Origin
 - A greater proportion of overnight and day visitors from New Brunswick.
 - A lesser proportion of overnight and day visitors from Massachusetts.
 - Visitor Demographics
 - A lesser proportion of overnight visitors over the age of 55, and a lower average age of visitors
 - A lesser proportion of day visitors earning less than \$50,000 per year
 - A greater proportion of day visitors who are married
 - Primary Purpose of Trip
 - Day visitors more likely to be traveling for shopping
 - Day and overnight visitors less likely to be visiting to get away to relax
 - Overnight visitors **less** likely to be visiting:
 - To enjoy nature
 - Because it's what we do every year
